SCHOOL REVIEW:

Schools undertake a school review every 4 years to inform the directions of the school's 4-year School Strategic Plan (SSP) (a legislative requirement for all schools).

The first component of the review is the pre-review self-evaluation where schools review their data and other evidence to form a collective view of current practice and areas for improvement.

This is followed by a review conducted by a panel, utilising the expertise of challenge partners and convened by an independent school reviewer.

Concurrent with this panel process, the school reviewer undertakes an assessment of the school's compliance with the Minimum Standards for Curriculum and Student Learning.

Cohuna Consolidated has a school review scheduled for Term 4 this year. We are currently working on our pre-review self-evaluation and as part of this process, we are seeking input from members of our school community regarding our Child Safe policies.
